To achieve this, we are proud to offer an exceptional layer of internal support through our Pupil Support Services Team, which includes:

- **School Social Worker:** Providing support to families and children facing complex challenges.
- **Mental Health Support Worker:** Focusing on emotional and mental health needs.
- **Wellbeing Success Centre Manager:** Supporting pupils in overcoming barriers to learning and promoting resilience.
- **Attendance Manager:** Ensuring that children can engage fully in their education by addressing attendance-related concerns.

For families who may need additional assistance, we can guide and support you through the **Early Help process**. Early Help is an approach designed to identify and address challenges early, before they escalate into more serious concerns.

What is Early Help in Birmingham?

Early Help in Birmingham is a coordinated approach to support children, young people, and families at the earliest opportunity. The process begins with an **Early Help Assessment (EHA)**, which helps us identify the specific areas where a family may need support. This assessment allows us to develop a tailored plan to address the needs of the family, which may include:

- Access to parenting support or advice.
- Assistance with housing, finances, or employment challenges.
- Help for children with emotional, behavioural, or educational needs.
- Connecting families with external agencies and community resources.

Early Help is a collaborative process, working with parents, carers, and other professionals to create a supportive network. It is entirely voluntary and designed to empower families, ensuring that the right help is provided at the right time.
