School Closure Due to Extreme Heat - Update

Following continued consideration of the weather forecast and the expected continuation of high temperatures tomorrow, we have made the decision to **close Turves Green Boys' School to pupils on Friday 26th June 2026.**

The safety and wellbeing of our pupils and staff is always our priority. Despite the measures we have in place, the forecast temperatures are expected to create conditions that may impact pupils' health, concentration and wellbeing throughout the school day.

All pupils will be expected in school on Monday 29th June 2026 in full school uniform at 8:35am. Year 10 pupils are reminded to return their signed consent forms for Careers Week activities taking place from Monday.

We appreciate that this decision may cause inconvenience for some families; however, it has been made with the best interests of our pupils in mind.

Provision for Vulnerable Pupils

We recognise that some families may require support during the closure. As a result, the school will remain open for a limited number of vulnerable pupils. If you believe your child meets this criteria and would like them to attend school on Friday 26th June 2026, please contact the postbox email by 3pm today.

Remote learning

As the school is required to close, pupils will continue their learning remotely to minimise disruption to their education and help them stay on track with their studies. Work will be provided on ClassCharts. Pupils will need to log in using their usual login details, please contact your house office via email if you need any login details to be re-sent.

Staying Safe in the Heat

During periods of extreme heat, we encourage all families to follow the guidance below:

- Drink plenty of water throughout the day, even if you do not feel thirsty.
- Stay indoors during the hottest part of the day where possible.
- Wear light-coloured, loose-fitting clothing.
- Apply sunscreen regularly when outdoors.
- Seek shade whenever possible.
- Avoid strenuous physical activity during the hottest parts of the day.
- Check regularly on younger children, older relatives and anyone who may be vulnerable to the effects of heat.

Open Water Safety

We are also aware that warm weather can lead young people to seek ways to cool down outdoors. We would ask parents and carers to remind their children of the dangers associated with swimming in open water.

Pupils should:

- Never swim in rivers, canals, lakes, reservoirs or quarries.
- Never enter open water without appropriate supervision.
- Be aware that water can be much colder than it appears, even during hot weather.
- Understand that strong currents, hidden obstacles and sudden drops in depth can pose serious risks.
- Only swim in designated, supervised swimming facilities.

We would be grateful if you could reinforce these safety messages with your child.
